The Solar System



The Rainforest

The emergent layer is the name given to the tops of trees that poke up above the rainforest canopy. It is very sunny here and only the strongest and tallest plants reach this level.

The canopy layer is found directly below the emergent layer. In this layer 70-90 percent of life exists in the trees. There are billions of leaves that cover the canopy layer. These leaves act as a solar panel and provide the source of energy in this layer. The leaves convert sunlight into energy through photosynthesis. Photosynthesis is the process by which plants convert carbon dioxide and water into oxygen and simple sugars. The canopy layer has a lot of fruits, seeds, flowers and leaves. Because of this there are a lot of animals in this layer. This layer also shields the understory layer from harsh sunlight and weather. In the canopy layer the trees never touch. It may look like it from an airplane but they are each separated. The animals must be able to jump and leap from tree to tree to get around. When many of the animals eat the fruit off the trees they drop the seed on the forest floor. This allows the seed to grow into a new tree making a lot more fruit for the animals to survive on.

The understory is the underlying layer of vegetation in a forest or wooded area, especially the trees and shrubs growing between the forest canopy and the forest floor. Plants in the understory comprise an assortment of seedlings and saplings of canopy trees together with specialist understory shrubs and herbs.

The tropical rainforest floor layer, or forest floor, is the ground layer of this biome. It lies beneath the emergent, canopy and understory layers, which is the reason why almost no sunlight reaches this area.



Weird words

Kerfuffle- It means to make a fuss or a bother, usually when people have different points of view.

Hullaballoo- A word that really sounds like what it means, hullaballoo (noun) is the loud noises and shouting that people make when they're angry.

Cacophony- Another word related to noise, a cacophony (noun) is a mixture of horrible sounds.

Ragamuffin- a person (often a child) who wears dirty and scruffy clothes – clothes that are just like rags!

Whippersnapper- today it's used for a young person who's too confident and perhaps a little cheeky! It's a perfect word to use for an inquisitive child who just can't stop questioning and correcting their parents!

Gobbledygook- words that are nonsense or have no meaning.

Gibberish- (noun) means the same as gobbledygook: nonsense words and phrases that sound like English but have little meaning.

Poppycock- trying to talk about something that a person knows absolutely nothing about or is untrue.

Discombobulate- means to confuse.

Flumox- (verb) to confuse a person a lot.

Curmudgeon- (noun) someone who's very bad-tempered and grumpy

Lackadaisical- used to describe someone that's lazy and has no enthusiasm or determination.

Woebegone- surrounded by sadness.

Lollygag- it actually means to be idle and lazy or to waste time.

Frankenfood- It's used informally for genetically modified (GM) foods. GM foods are those that have been scientifically altered in some way, that haven't grown naturally.
